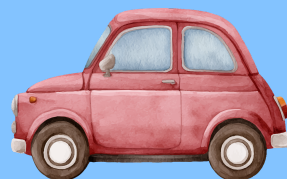

Quinn has been an exceptional student-athlete throughout middle and high school. While he also tried his hand at lacrosse and tennis, his true passion shone on the volleyball court, where he served as a dedicated, leadership-driven setter. His hard work and sportsmanship culminated in receiving his school's prestigious Sportsman of the Year award.

Quinn's favorite memory from HPC is all of the pumpkin patches and around-town events that he's participated in.





Benjamin Mills is graduating Summa cum laude from Hamburg High School. He was captain of the Hamburg Baseball team which won the Section VI title this year. He won a leadership award, scholar athlete award and ECIC 2nd team all star for baseball this year and holds the school record for most stolen bases in one season. Benjamin was a member of Hamburg soccer, Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, National Honor Society, and the Academy of Finance program. He is attending RIT in the fall, majoring in Cyber Security.

A little over one hundred years ago, June 19, 1888, a small group met in Hamburg with representatives of the Buffalo Presbytery, for the purpose of organizing a Presbyterian Church. The meeting took place in the building still located on the corner of Lake Street and Linwood Avenue. This was our beginning, yet we can go back further in time to learn more of 'our roots'.

About 1826, as a result of the work of several itinerant preachers, a Free Will Baptist Church was formed in White's Corners. In 1830, they erected a church building which they later sold to the newly organized Roman Catholic congregation. They built a new place of worship in 1845 on Lake Street across from what is now the Hamburg Village Park.

As years passed, White Corners became the Village of Hamburg. And with the years, the Free Will Baptist Church first flourished, then faltered, and lost membership. Finally, unable to sustain their congregation, a movement was started in 1887 to revitalize their church by entering the Presbyterian denomination, becoming the WESTMINSTER PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF HAMBURG, but in August 1888, renamed THE LAKE STREET PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH by which it was known for the next 65 years.

Of the original group of 18 members, nine were transfers from the disbanded Free Will Baptist Church, six by letters of transfer from other Presbyterian Churches, and three joined on Profession of Faith. Use of the Lake Street building continued during periods of growth in membership and frequent changes in ministerial leadership from 1888 until 1920. In that year the Rev. Frank O. Leonard brought a ten year period of stability, followed by the Rev. William Brown, who served for fourteen years from 1931 until his death in 1945.

During the tenure of these two leaders, it became increasingly apparent that the century-old Lake Street building could no longer provide

adequate space for a full church program for the fast growing congregation. Although the need was there, the dream of building a new place of worship was not to be realized for many years.

This need for a new building persisted with serious planning beginning in 1946. By this time the Rev. Fred Webber had succeeded the Rev. Mr. Brown and was instrumental in directing the building venture to completion. Things began to happen! A fund drive was launched in earnest January 1949. A new manse was built on Center Street to house the Webber family. The old manse located at 177 Main Street was sold and moved to a location on Quinby Drive to make room for the new edifice. Groundbreaking took place on March 23, 1952. The dream became a reality on September 20, 1953, when Dedication Services were held in the brand new facility, now named THE HAMBURG PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

How indebted we are to the many people who planned, worked, and pledged as they gave their time, talents and money to make all of this possible. Some are no longer with us, though fortunately there are many "LongTymers" in our midst who remember with pride, what they accomplished through their fellowship and hard work.

Today, we do not sit back enjoying the fruits of their labors. A Church is more than brick and mortar! It is the people gathering within its walls to glorify God and who give service beyond the building to all humanity. People give the building life, making it a place for worship and study, for serving and caring; a place where music and laughter is heard and joys and concerns are shared; a place where signs of vitality abound in mission and ministry outreach!

This is OUR challenge! Let us be proud of our heritage, grateful for the fine leadership of the present, and ever mindful of the need to work and plan for the future.

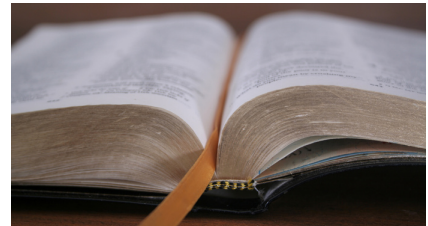
